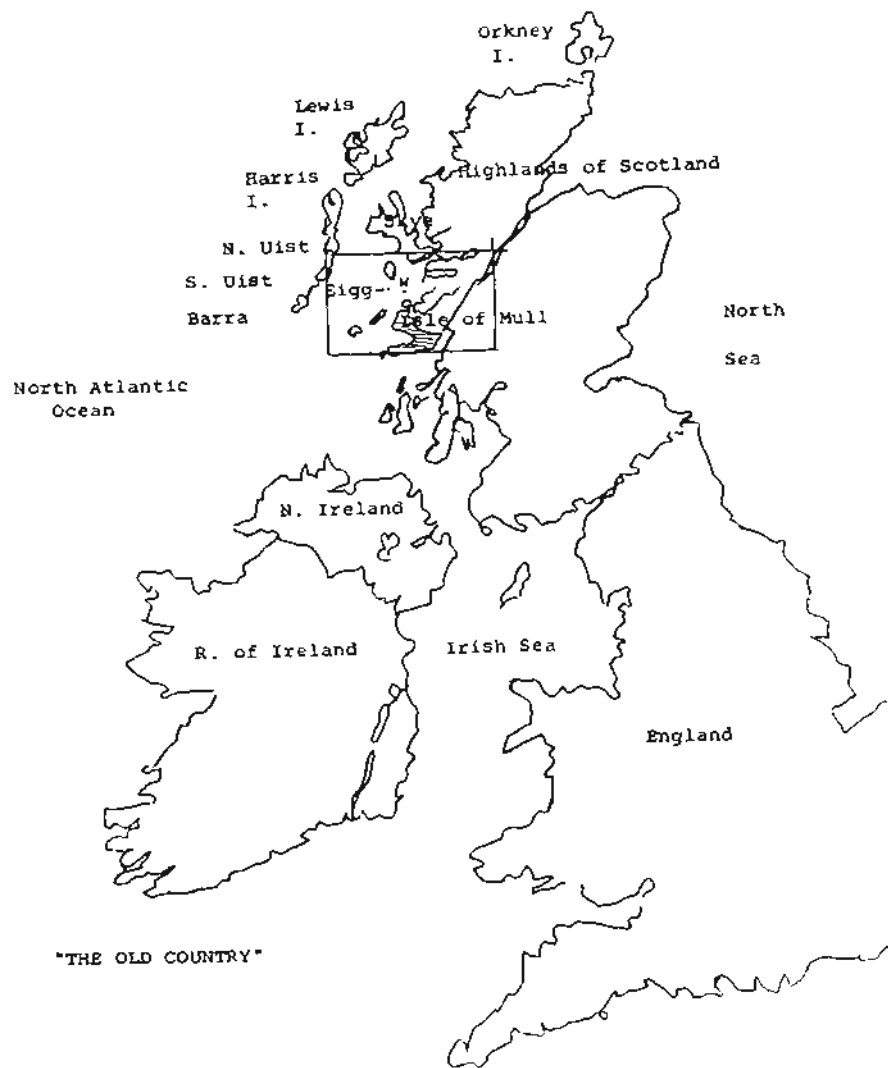

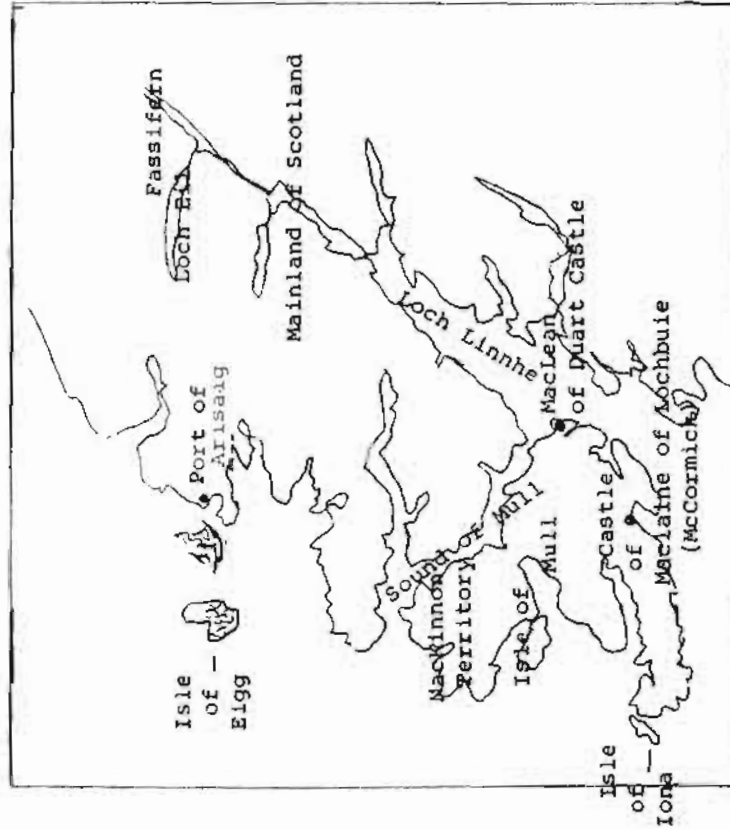

INTRODUCTION

While reminiscing at the kitchen table in the home of my sister, Joann Graham, her young son John asked, "Mom, who was my grandfather?" John was born the year his grandfather died. On that day, this book changed from a hobby to an effort dedicated to John Graham and all the McCormick children to come.

I have been gathering this information as a labor of love since 1969. It took me from Nova Scotia to the Yukon and the Northwest Territories. About five years ago, Mary Devine joined me as a co-author, and the book has since fallen into place. Word of our work spread and a number of relatives were willing to help.

There were two questions in our minds when researching: Why did so many Scots emigrate from Scotland to North America in the 1700's? And how did they arrive in Glengarry?

From early times the Irish and the Scots were on the move to escape religious persecution, famine or both. Over the generations, their names and religion changed, from McDonald and Protestant in Scotland, to O'Donald and Catholic in Ireland,¹ from Cormac in Ireland to MacCormaig in Scotland. The name "Cormac" in Ireland goes back to the 6th century. According to Seumas MacManus, Cormac was the grandson of Conn, King of Hundred Battles, belonged to the Clann Chunn, A.D. 157.² Clan Donald was also known as Clann Chunn and as Clann Chola (Colla).³ Here we have the same people known by different names and Clans in different countries.

The following is a legend told with immense pride:

"For generations the McCormicks were like nomads, finally settling on the Isle of Mull. This was Maclaine territory - the Maclaine of Lochbuie. A proclamation was issued to the McCormick sept, whose number was not great. If they showed allegiance to the Maclaine Clan, they could stay and wear the tartan. They stayed, wore the tartan, and still do. From then on the Maclaines showed favor to the McCormicks for the allegiance to the Chief."⁴

Scottish history tells of a young MacCormick who was a faithful and heroic companion to the wounded Lochbuie Chief in a successful

raid on the MacLean of Duart Clan. A Lochbuie had a plaque placed at the castle gate with the words: "Biadh is Deoch do MhacCormaig" (Food and drink to MacCormick).¹

Why did so many Scots emigrate in the 1700's? The answer came to us as genealogy handed down, confirmed in existing historical texts.

Under the Clan system, the family² was protected. Governing the highlands while this system prevailed was no easy task for the English. Only by breaking up the family would the Crown have a tight hold on the highlands of Scotland. The antagonism between the Crown and the Clans of the highlands had festered since the early 1600's, setting Clan against Clan and highland against lowland.³ The pride the Chief of a Clan instilled in his men was fierce;⁴ they were always ready to lay down their lives for him. Thus, when Bonnie Prince Charlie called "to arms" in 1745, he had a smattering of Clans from the highlands and the lowlands behind him.⁵ He was beaten badly at the battle of Culloden, better known as the "Battle of '45".

The highlanders' pride was broken and defeat came hard. They had fought a bitter and courageous battle with few replacements for fallen men. The time was right to put into effect the Disarming Act of 1746. Yet despite the efforts of the English, the Clan system remained unbroken even though the great exodus of the 1700's spread clansmen all over the world.

After the battle of '45, the clearing of the highlands began in earnest. The lairds razed dwellings and drove the impoverished tenants from farms to make more room for sheep, a more profitable commodity.⁶ Battle weary clansmen gathered their families once more and moved to the Isles of Eigg and Skye.⁷ It is from the Isle of Eigg that we are beginning this genealogy.

How did the immigrants arrive in Glengarry? A passenger list of the "British Queen" provided the answer.⁸ It was from Cleadale Estate in the Isle of Eigg that 23 adults and their families found their way to Arisaig, Scotland to Board the "British Queen", leaving port on August 16, 1790 and arriving two months later in Quebec. Two of the passengers were name Donald McCormick, each having dependants.

When the passengers landed in 1790, they were so poor they faced the possibility of starvation that first winter. They wintered near Montreal. Myles⁹ Macdonnell had put in two petitions for provisions for them to Lord Dorchester. In the second petition he asked for five or six bateaux and provisions for five to six weeks so they might come to the Lunenburg District.

"After the immigrants had landed in Quebec, and once on shore, they kissed the ground and then out of their baggage would come the highland kilt and bagpipes. This tightly kept secret could once again become a source of great clannish pride. The kilt would be donned and the pibroch sounded."¹⁰

Others arrived in Nova Scotia where a Scottish settlement was already established. "In 1797, Donald McCormick from the Isle of Eigg arrived in Nova Scotia. He had three sons, John, Robert and Roderick."¹

Living in those days was a test of endurance that cannot be imagined by today's standards.²

The Glengarry pioneers may have been a very poor lot but they were not wanting in their fierce pride and dignity of character that set the Scotch highlander apart in any walk of life he chose. It is with this pride in our heritage that we undertake this account of our ancestors, the McCormicks of Glengarry.

Special thanks are due to Mark Sabourin for editing, to Andrea Whyte McCormick for her calligraphy. To Tena MacSweyn for her tremendous work on Book I, to the family of the late John J. McCormick, without his help Book II would not be finished.

A large amount of the information was obtained from the Glengarry Genealogical Society, Lancaster, Ontario, Alex Fraser, U.E. genealogist, on the early McCormicks. We will refer to it as G.G.S.

With the confusing repetition of names so common among our ancestors, it is possible that we have placed a name in the wrong generation. Of course, we assume full responsibility for all errors and omissions and encourage Readers, to bring them to our attention.

Earl Munro and his wife related a delightful story about Mr. Munro's grand aunt, Betsey Munro daughter of Finlay Munro and Christy Ross of Lot 19 in the 8th concession of Charlottenburg. Betsey was also a great grand daughter of Hugh Munro U.E.L. and Catherine Campbell born in Scotland.

Betsey was swept away on horse-back by Neil McCormick, to be married.

"You know, it was right at threshing time too. She handed down all her belongings from an upstairs window to Neil waiting below. Neil took her to live in his area, McCormick Post Office area. It was always thought that Betsey turned Catholic, but she was buried in the Kirkhill Church cemetery. Neil and Betsey had three children but all died in infancy."

Obituary - Mrs. Christopher MacDonald.¹

"It is with profound regret that we this week chronicled the death of Mary A. McCormick, beloved wife of Christopher MacDonald, which occurred at the residence of her brothers, Messrs. Duncan (Dan) and John McCormick, Main Street

South, Alexandria, Ont. on January 5th., 1915. The deceased who was 55 years of age, leaves besides her husband, three brothers, Messrs. Duncan, John and Angus of Alexandria a well known musical group."

Mary Ann was a member of this musical family. She played the organ for her brothers at some of the functions at which they were requested to play.

A visit with Mrs. Agnes MacDonald¹ brought out an interesting story on the McCormick Bros.

"Yes, there were two McCormick brothers who played the violin. They used to come to visit us. Always sitting in the same position, on the edge of the same chair, with their backs rigid and the violins neatly on their laps. They were extremely shy boys. Now, mind you, they could not read music, so this was the reasons for the visits.

If a new Scotch tune came out in sheet music, they would have me play it over and over until they understood it, and then played it themselves. On this one occasion there was a particular piece of music that had come out in a new modernized version for piano, by the name of 'The Bonnie Lass of Bonacord', in the Scots Skinner's book. I played it over and over for them and even sang it too. They were very quick to get it, but when it came to the minor notes they were lost. They eventually got it. They were shy boys, but such gentlemen."

"...My uncle, Dr. J. T. Hope, was one of their fans, and once when they were elderly men (approx. 1930), he took me to see them for a few minutes, to hear them play. In fact we only saw one dear old soul and he was almost too feeble to play at all. Jim always admired the way they played 'The Lass O'Gowrie'."²

"John and Dan McCormick built and lived in the house on Main Street, S., Alexandria, across from Costello's home. One was a fiddler, but the other was a violinist."³

"Angus McCormick lived on Main Street next to Donald John (Saddler) Macdonell, on the other side of Alex Willie MacMillan's Undertaking parlour (now Dubeau Upholstery). Angus played the violin, also worked with his brothers, repairing and building homes."¹

"The house of John and Dan's on Main Street S., was later bought by Henry Duggan Sr. Henry (nephew) and his wife Isabel Routhier lived there. Mr. Duggan renovated it, by having brick siding and a verandah put on the house. Mr. T. G. Barbara then bought it and now Remi Prudhomme of Prudhomme Ins. The Bros. moved to Bishop Street, where they built two more homes. Dan and John lived in one of the two houses. One was later bought by Harry Keyes."¹

"About (1934) she didn't remember the year, John was living next to us. She remembered him well. Every morning he would come out in the front yard to cut the grass with a scythe. One morning he did not come out, so mother and Mrs. Currier went in to see. Mr. McCormick was dead and had been for some time. She called the priest. Poor Mr. McCormick, he was a good man."²

Obituary³

"The deceased was the son of Angus McCormick and Margaret Cameron 17/3rd. Lochiel. John McCormick died at his home on Bishop Street, Alexandria. In 1880 the family moved to Alexandria and John McCormick took up carpentry as his trade and together with his brother Angus, now the only surviving member of the family, and possessing more than an ordinary musical ability, specialized as violinists and for years their services were much in demand at entertainments, dances, etc. The late Mr. McCormick had a wide circle of friends who admired his many excellent qualities."

"Carpentry was their livelihood, but their first love was music."⁴

"Escapes train miraculously ¹

It's not too often someone who gets run over by a train, lives to tell the tale, but 20 year old Ranald MacGillis of Alexandria is one of them.

The Western University student had the first three cars of a C.N. freight train pass over him at about 3:30 Saturday morning as he lay between the tracks of the Montreal-Ottawa line, near the Carnation siding.

He was taken to Glengarry Memorial Hospital in a state of shock, but suffered no physical injuries. He still remembers almost nothing of the entire night.

The train, which had just pulled out of the siding, stopped almost immediately when the engineer saw Mr. MacGillis. After calling police, they went to help him, but he had already got out from under the train.

According to Lancaster OPP, Mr. MacGillis had been walking along the track from McCormick Road. He had been involved in an accident about 1.5 kilometres east of Alexandria along the road earlier. The car owned by his father, Gerald MacGillis of St. Paul Street was totalled."

Alex and Donald MacDonald³W1/2-9/5th Kenyon spoke with pride of
their Gaelic ancestry: theirs was the one home in Kenyon where Gaelic was the
only language spoken in the house for five generations. It was considered
almost treason to speak English in the home. The Gaelic language had been
forbidden in S.S No. 5 Kenyon School, which resulted in Alex and Donald
becoming bilingual.

Donald speaks of winter burial of "Long Robert" McCormick and of
the Kenyon floods.

"Old Robbie was very tall. He died in the winter. There was
no place for the body over the winter, so he had to be buried
in the cemetery but the ground was frozen. Well sir, they got
Joe McDonell to start digging. Joe always did those jobs, he
was a good neighbour. After digging most of the day, he

only got down about 4 inches. Another neighbour said that he'd give it a try. He too only got down another 4 inches. Now the funeral was to be the next day, so they got Kenny Robinson to dynamite the grave. Father MacMillan came along and said, "It's a good thing you fellows don't have to bury him standing up!"

Kenyon Floods

Some may remember the swamp areas in Kenyon.

"In the spring the water rose. It started down in the 3rd. (con. Kenyon) and got deeper as it came north. The deepest was from the "little fifth" to the Old Ridge road. There's a natural ridge in the land that goes west from Highway 34 to the Indian lands. When they put in the 6th of Kenyon road, it had to be raised 15 ft. to get above the floods. There was a post that we used to keep an eye on to measure the height of the water. It was removed when the road was put in. Och yes, my father built a raft for Lizzy (John the Sawyer) MacDonald. She was the teacher in S.S No. 5. She would cut through the 4th (con. of Kenyon) on her way to school. Without this raft, she would have missed many days. She was paid well too, \$100 a year."

The theory by some is that the swamps are fed by the underground river that feeds Loch Garry from the St. Lawrence River. Still others say the Loch Garry is fed by springs.

"Behind the barn in the field, were three bogs in which a number of animals were lost in the early days. Many times my sister and I would chase the cows in the back field. We thought it great fun to direct them in such a way that they would follow the grassy knolls between the bogs, and we'd watch the knolls bounce. No one was ever hurt or no animal lost that I remember."¹

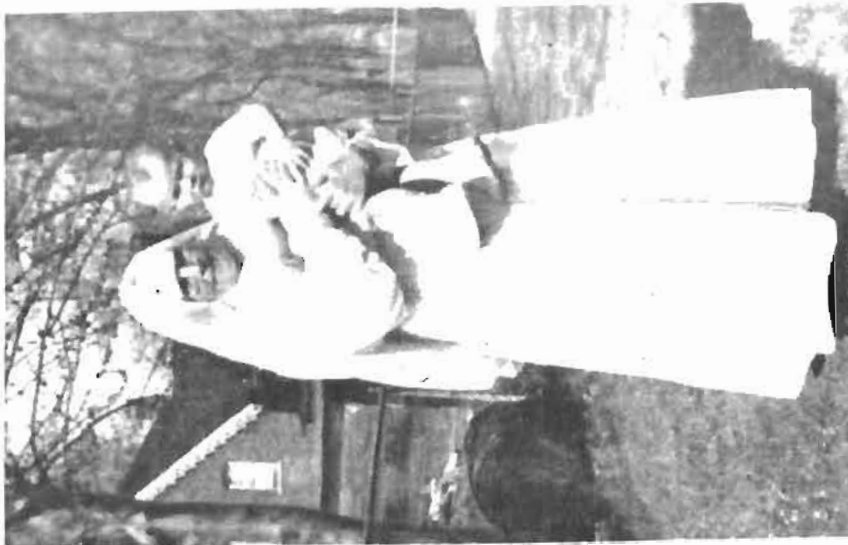

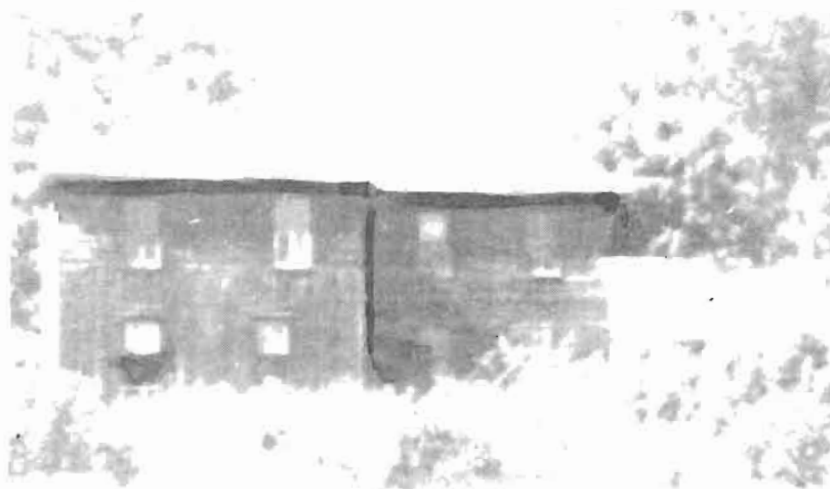

"Duncan was killed in a mining explosion in Tacoma, Washington. The night before he was killed, he wrote a letter home stating how lonesome he was. "When I² was about 7 or 8 years old, Saturday was the day for visiting, 'east the road', the McCormick Road. The McLennans⁴ had a large family with only one living daughter, Etta, my age. Later they moved into town and we lived directly across the street. Ellen McLennan was widowed when her family was young and she did a marvelous job bringing them up, in the depression. This did not take away from her wonderful sense of humor. I can still hear her saying after one of the boys would tell her a joke, 'Ah, be quiet' and then laugh so heartily."

“When the McLennans lived across the street in Alexandria from us, Donald was working on the railroad, repairing ties. One July or August Saturday afternoon, he came home early. He didn't 'look good' at all to us. Immediate bed rest was the prescription given until the doctor finished the tests. Father 'Ewen' MacDonald dropped in, as was customary, just to say hello. He diagnosed Donald's illness as typhoid Fever. Dr. Dolan and Dr. Thompson had also received the same results and immediately tested the well on the McLennan property. In those days, raw sewage found it's way to the Garry River and contaminated some wells.

His recovery was assured by the marvelous care his mother gave him. The most vivid memory I have of his illness was the large amount of bananas he consumed each day. Evidently it helped, as he recuperated completely. Donald had a number of jobs. The one for which he will be remembered was bartender. In the hotel in Alexandria while collecting information, one of the gentlemen said, "It's too bad Donald McLennan isn't here. He knew everyone and could tell a funny story about each one too."

"When the 1st. Battalion SD&G Highlanders holds its 34th annual reunion at the Cornwall Armouries on June 6 and 7, two local veterans will be honored for their unique service to the regiment during World War II.

"Robert (Bob) McLennan, of Alexandria, now living at 1400 Newark St., Cornwall, and Peter Alec MacLean of St. Elmo, presently farming at RR 2, Maxville, joined the regiment in Cornwall in June 1940 and were posted to No. 16 Platoon of "Dog" Company.

"Following the long training period in Canada and England they landed with the regiment at Bernieres-sur-Mer on "D" Day, June 6, 1944. At the end of hostilities on May 5, 1945, only three men of "D" Company had served continuously as infantrymen since "D" Day, the regiment having suffered about 1300 casualties of which 286 were fatal. The third man was also a Cornwall native. The late John Labonte.

"As a corporal "Bob" served as infantry section leader with Peter Alec his Bren gunner and on July 9 had the distinction of being the first Canadian soldier to reach the centre of Caen.

"The Military Medal was awarded to Corporal McLennan for exceptional gallantry in action during the very heavy fighting in August, south of Caen which led to the closing of the Falaise Gap and to Peter Alec for bravery at the crossing of the Ems River at Leer, Germany, a few days before the war ended.

"They both emerged unscathed and remained good friends to today."

She was affectionately known as Mrs. Paddy. After moving to Alexandria,
they lived on Elgin St. W. and had seven children. Mrs. Paddy never showed
her annoyance with us for interfering with her oldest daughter Margaret's
work in the house, she had such a lovely disposition.

Many years passed before I visited her again. She was a widow living
with her daughter and son-in-law, Catherine and Archie MacDougall. Her
memory was still sharp. She remembered the names of all her brothers and
sisters, her father and mother and her grandparents on her father's side. The
story of Duncan, her brother, was as vivid that day as the day it happened.
She also told me of her grandfather, John McCormick,¹ who eloped with
Isabella MacDonald from Lancaster. Even at this late date, she put her hands
to her face to imply "the shame of it all". Then, with a saucy expression, she
laughed and said "Today, they do a lot worse", and laughed again.

Today, (1983) Mrs. Paddy is a resident of the Alexandria Community

Nursing Home. She's still bright at times, but her eyesight is failing (b.1888).

Paddy worked as a caretaker of the Alexandria High School until his retirement. All who entered A.H.S. knew him well.

Paddy was the 7th son of the 7th son and therefore was reported to have healing powers. One day, a niece of Paddy's after weeks of suffering with an ugly carbuncle on the back of her neck; was told that her uncle was coming to see her. When Paddy arrived, all were whisked out to the kitchen, save the suffering niece. When Paddy emerged a couple of minutes later, he announced that the carbuncle would break before the next day. It did and drained clean.¹

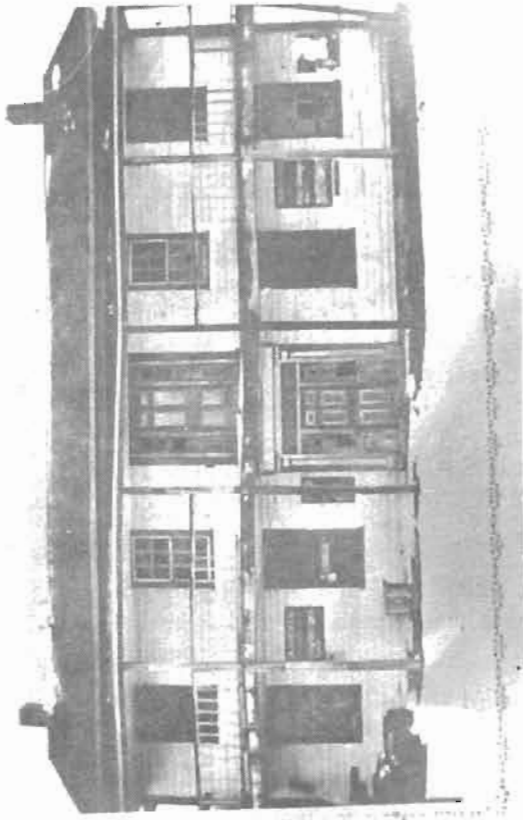

BOOK TWO

Book II will describe the descendants of ROBERT McCormick, brother of JOHN (Jenet MacGinnis) of Book I, and son of Donald. There was also a sister, Nancy McCormick.

"Nancy McCormick was married to Donald MacDonell¹ who was the first MacDonell on the Eigg Road (3rd. concession road). He was the ancestor of John Lawrence Danny John and us."

"Nancy McCormaic, nighean Donald, ic Robert"² died August 27th., 1859, at the age of 96 yrs. and widow of Donald McDonald (MacDonell) of Eigg, Glengarry.

"Donald MacDonell was first settler in Lochiel Parish - arriving before 1787, Donald MacDonell had 2 sons.

(1) Donald and (2) Duncan²

(1) Donald MacDonell was a bachelor. He gave an acre of land for a cemetery. First recorded burial was that of Catherine MacDonald widow of Robert MacCormaic - 90 yrs. of age, died September 22, 1851, St. Alexander's Parish.

(2) Duncan MacDonell had 2 sons. Duncan's grandson, Dunc MacDonell went to the Dakotas when young and was always known as 'Dakota Dunc.'

Robert brought from the bursar of University of Colleges of Toronto the North half of lot 19 in the 4th of Lochiel for eight hundred dollars, in 1859.

Robert's son John was granted 200 acres on lot 17/3rd. of Lochiel in 1804, registered in 1848.

Donald McCormick's son Robert, b. 1760 in Scotland married twice
1st wife Oirig (Harriet) Stewart (Stuart)
2nd wife Catherine MacDonald (1761-1851)

There is a legend handed down about this Robert and his first wife Oirig.

It seems Oirig was of royal blood so the story goes. Her family did not approve of the match. When Robert decided to try his luck in the New World, Oirig was forbidden to sail with him. Whether it was a plan or not, just as Robert's vessel was about to set sail, Oirig placed their infant daughter in Robert's arms. By doing this Oirig figured her family would soon consent to her joining her husband in the New World.

This story was told many times to me (Mary Devine) and the family by Grandfather. He would be laughing when he was telling it. I guess he thought it was a pretty slick trick on the part of his grandparents. The funny part is we laughed also because we thought it was just another one of Granpa's stories but read on maybe the last laugh was on us.

ROBERT McCORMICK 23/3rd Lochiel

This legend so often told by Rory, a grandson of Robert, could very well be true.

In 1787 Nancy McCormick, daughter of Donald and sister of Robert, was already settled in Glengarry Co. Ontario with her husband Donald MacDonell. Nancy was born in Scotland in 1763. This is substantiated through Father John McDonald's diary. We know of Donald and Nancy having at least three sons Donald, Duncan and Alexander, who was born in 1807, and baptized in St. Andrews. This family was the first MacDonells to settle on the Eigg road in Glengarry.

In 1790 Donald McCormick, Nancy's father, came to Canada on the British Queen, landing at Quebec in October after a two month voyage. According to the passenger manifest, Donald had two dependants. One was over 12 yrs of age (the age of adulthood) which was Robert. Robert was married to Oirig Stuart and had three children born in Scotland, John age 6, Mary C. age 3 and Catherine age 2. Oirig did not come to Canada at this time. According to the legend her family did not want her to leave Scotland. Just as the British Queen was to sail from Arisaig, Oirig placed her infant daughter in the arms of her husband reasoning that her family would not keep her away from the child for long. Robert already had his son John with him and now he also had the baby to care for. He was also leaving two brothers, John and Roderick in Scotland. Dividing a family in such away offered protection for the clan. If Donald and this part of the family did not survive, there were two brothers back in Scotland to carry on the name. Donald paid L3. 6s. 1d. for passage for himself, his son Robert and grandson John. There was a cousin, Donald, and his son Rory on this voyage.

Seven years later in 1797, we find Donald McCormick and his three sons Robert, John and Roderick arriving in Nova Scotia according to papers found

in an old Bible of Hector McCormick's. No mention is made of women or wives but we have record of a son John being born to Robert and Oirig in 1801. Oirig must have died at the time of John's birth or shortly thereafter. We have no record of her death. It could have happened before they reached Glengarry. Robert must have been in dire need of a mother for his young son because in 1802 he was married to a Catherine McDonald. In the same year, 1802, Catherine and Robert had a daughter, they named her Oirig (after his first wife).

It would appear that Donald and Robert after acquainting themselves with the country with the help of Nancy and her husband, returned to Scotland to bring the rest of the family to Canada.

Donald, Robert and Catherine and John could have come to Glengarry with Fr. Alexander Macdonell when he stopped in Nova Scotia, on his way from Scotland, to pick up anyone who wished to settle in Glengarry. This was in 1802. Roderick stayed in Nova Scotia.

Another son Hector was born to Robert and Catherine in 1803 according to the St. Raphaels' records.

A claim to John McCormick, eldest son of Robert, of Donald for 200 acres of land - 17/3rd. Lochiel in 1804 and registered in 1848.

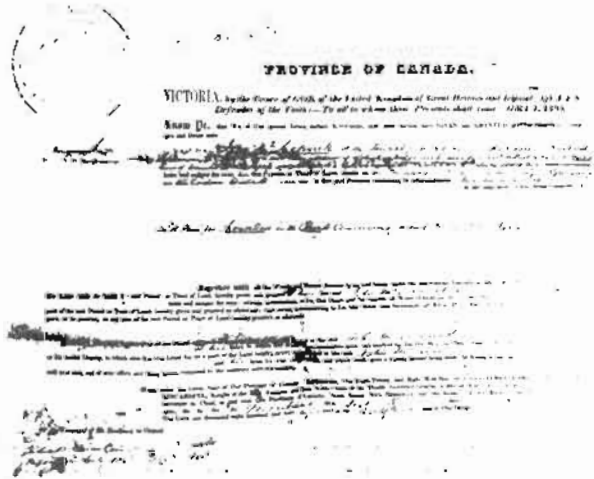

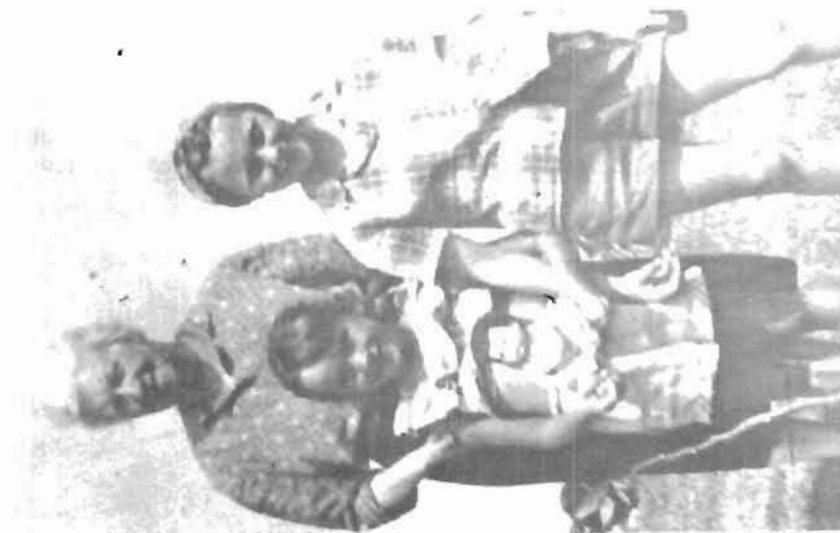

Obituary - Annie MacRae¹

"One of Cornwall's oldest residents, Annie MacRae relict of
the late John McCormick of Lancaster died at the residence

of her daughter on Water Street, Cornwall on Friday of last week (January 20, 1899) at the ripe old age of 93. Rory McCormick²Celebrates 102nd Birthday.²

"Roderick(Rory) McCormick, Glengarry grand old man, will pass another milestone tomorrow when he marks his 102nd birthday. A Mass for his spiritual and temporal welfare will be sung in St. Finnan's Cathedral that morning and members of the family and friends will offer congratulations personally later in the day at the home of his son Robert and Mrs. McCormick, with whom he resides.

Though now confined to his room, he is able to be up and about daily and enjoys the visits of family and friends. Without his eyesight, for the past 26 years, Alexandria's centenarian enjoys his other faculties and his memory is still quite clear.

Mr. McCormick and this newspaper were featured on the program, "Ontario's Patriarchs and Papers", last Friday night over CFRB, Toronto, but unfortunately many in Alexandria, who tuned in were unable to hear that station clearly. The sponsoring Cities Services Oil Co., is endeavoring to arrange for its rebroadcast over a more accessible station at a later date.

The script opened with a salute to this paper's diamond anniversary in February and briefly reviewed its early history under the management of the late Col. A.G.F. Macdonald, its editor for fifty years. There was mention too of Alexandria's proximity to the power development of the St. Lawrence seaway; to the new Carnation Milk plant abuilding and to Glengarry's fine dairy industry.

Data on Mr. McCormick and incidents from his early years were related on the second half of the program; his early years at Glen Nevis and in early manhood, his experiences while building timber snow-sheds in the Rockies to protect the young C.P.R. from disastrous snowslides. There were Mr. McCormick's recollections of the life of Cariboo Cameron,¹ whose funeral he attended while in British Columbia.

The script told of a memorable date in Mr. McCormick's life - March 1, 1900. Our centenarian was farming just north of Alexandria in those days. One of the worst snowstorms of the winter blocked all roads when, early that morning, he and his neighbours heard the clamor of church bells and factory whistles in town. Thinking the town afire, he set out to help and battled the drifts all the way. Reaching town more dead than alive, he found our citizens celebrating the Relief of Ladysmith in the Boer War. As the scripter put it, "there was no fire, but I'll bet there was plenty of firewater."

Through the courtesy of the Cities Service Company, this paper will shortly present to Mr. McCormick his portrait in charcoal done by the well-known Canadian artist, Egbert C. Reed."

Grampa McCormick,² born on January 12, 1850, lived to the age of one hundred and two years and five months and died on May 19, 1952. He had many stories to tell and lots of time to tell them, as he was blind for the last thirty-two years of his life. He lived through many changes. Many is the time

he spoke of old Sir John A. (MacDonald) our first Prime Minister and the shooting of D'Arcy MacGee. Grampa was a bugler boy at the time of the Fenian Raids and he claimed he crossed the river with the "Red Coats". He worked on the building of the C.P.R. as far west as British Columbia.

Grampa was seldom without his constant companion, his pipe. He always had a good handful of wooden matches in his vest pocket. One weekend while I was at home, mother thought it was a good time for her to do some shopping. Grampa went upstairs for his afternoon nap and I, seeing an opportunity, decided to wash the kitchen floor. But Grampa decided he wasn't tired and came downstairs to keep me company. The floor was only half done so I put him on a chair on the back verandah so we could talk while I worked. Shortly thereafter, I smelled something burning and on glancing at Grampa saw a small curl of smoke coming from his vest pocket. Without a word I grabbed a dipper of water and poured it in Grampa's vest pocket. Shocked, he stood up and cursed me with all the words he had learned over his ninety years. Apparently he had put his hot pipe on top of the wooden matches in his vest pocket and ignited them. Did poor mother ever get an earful when she arrived home.

Grampa must have had the best false teeth ever made. They were only out of his mouth for cleaning. He could eat corn on the cob and fresh herring with no problem. Often after a tiring day when he fell into a deep sleep, he'd snore his teeth right out of his mouth and then the search would begin. If they were not to be found in bed, he would look under it. Getting down on his knees beside the bed and using the hook of his cane as a catch-all, he would pull it over the hardwood floor in the hope of finding his teeth. This could happen at any hour of the night. Needless to say it wasn't long before he had lots of help. Who could sleep with that racket going on?

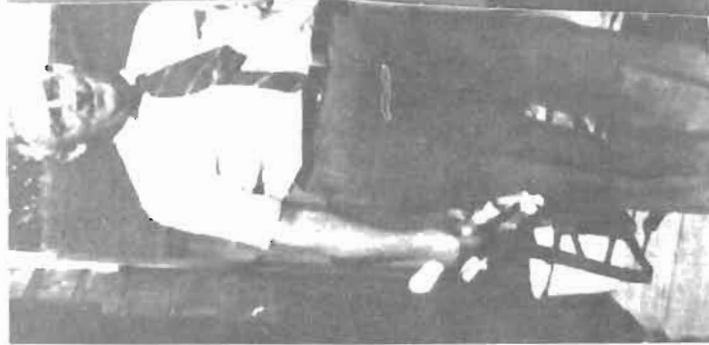

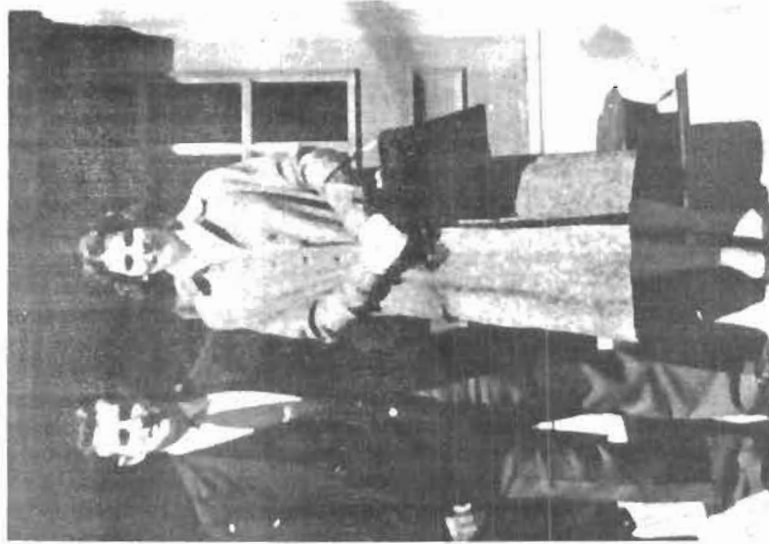

Sally and Gertie MacDonald were partners in a business venture - MacDonald Reg'd on 392 Victoria Ave. Westmount in Montreal. It was a dress shop whose name became identified with the prestigious women of Westmount. Gertie tells of two distinguished retired spinsters who were undecided on a particular dress. One said to the other "Do you like this dress." The other answered "But Mary, it won't go with the chairs."

Some of the credit for this well established clientele was the superb workmanship of a young Italian widow, Julia Angelini who had two children to support. Looking for work after her husband died was not easy in a new country and not able to speak the language. Sally hired this seamstress. After 25 years, Sally died suddenly leaving the shop to Gertie, her sister and partner. Mrs. Angelini had learned the trade well from seamstress to management. Her appearance had changed to a beautiful confident lady. Gertie had continued as owner of the shop, doing well until about 5 years ago when she sold the shop

to Mrs. Angelini who was loyal to the MacDonald sisters therefore would not change the name. When Bill 101 said they had to change to French, Mrs. Angelini replaced Reg'd on the sign to read "MacDonald Boutique".

"I went to S.S. No. 14 Public School, starting at the age of seven years (1900). It was on John Hector's (McCormick) farm, 20/3rd. Lochiel, just a short walk from home 24/3rd. Lochiel. There were 75 children registered to attend school from grades 1-8, but on any given day there would not be more than 35 students. This was still considered a big school. Many were missing because they had to work on the farm or they were sick.

I had two teachers in the four years I went to No. 14. The first was Miss McDonell (Balavein.) She was very cross. She'd say every morning when she came in, "I'm in good shape this morning, anyone want to fight?" The second teacher was Miss Carrol, a niece of Father Foley's from Finch. She was grand. Memories from Florence Gelineau (McCormick)

"When I was about 7 or 8 years old, I used to love to go visiting the girls at McCormick Post Office (Mary Ann and Catherine Theresa). They used to have samples of literature and material that today we call junk mail, come through the mails. Mary Ann would take the samples and pass them around to the girls who came to visit. We would play with them. There would be Cassie Cameron, Marybelle (J.J.) and myself. We would have a grand old time making things with these samples of wall paper or ribbon cloth. The time passed quickly, first thing I knew, it would

be dark. I had about 1 mile to walk through "Logie's Bush". One of the neighbour boys liked to frighten the girls by hiding along the way. I wasn't afraid, so I told myself, as I knew I could outrun him. Just the same my father (Rory McCormick) wasn't taking any chances. He would come to meet me. I would hear that beautiful sound, father whistling, and feel safe as no boy would dare show his face around me when my father was so close by."

“St. Martin of Tours Church, Glen Robertson, was the scene of a very pretty wedding on Tuesday morning, 30th of September, when Mr. Roderick McCormick 20/3rd. Lochiel and Miss Mary Christina McDonald, daughter of John D. McDonald, of Montreal, formerly of this place, were united in marriage. The ceremonies being performed by Rev. D. McDonald P.P in the presence of friends of the contracting parties. The bride was becomingly attired in a costume of cream Bedford beige with white hat trimmed with plumes. She was attended by her cousin, Miss Flora Chisholm, who was dressed in cream serge with hat to match. The groom was assisted by his brother Dan McCormick. The groom's gift to the bride was a gold watch and chain, to the bridesmaid a gold locket, and to the groomsman a pair of gold cuff links.

After the ceremony, the wedding party headed by Piper D.A. McIntosh repaired to the home of the bride's uncle, Mr. Angus H. McDonald, where a sumptuous dinner awaited them. The afternoon was pleasantly spent in singing and dancing. Piper McIntosh and A.H. McDonald also rendered some excellent music.

Mr. and Mrs. McCormick left by the 4:45 PM train amid showers of rice and good wishes for eastern points. The bride travelling in a blue suit, returning Wednesday evening to Alexandria, where they were met by a number of friends and accompanied to the home of the groom where supper was served. In the evening the party repaired to the hall, headed by Piper McIntosh and dancing was indulged in the sweet strain of the violin played by the McCormick Bros. The evening's program included pipe music by W. Dewar of Kirk Hill, sword dance, highland fling, and scotch reels. After which all left for their homes in the wee sma' hours wishing Mr. and Mrs. McCormick many years of happiness. They were the receipt of many valuable gifts."

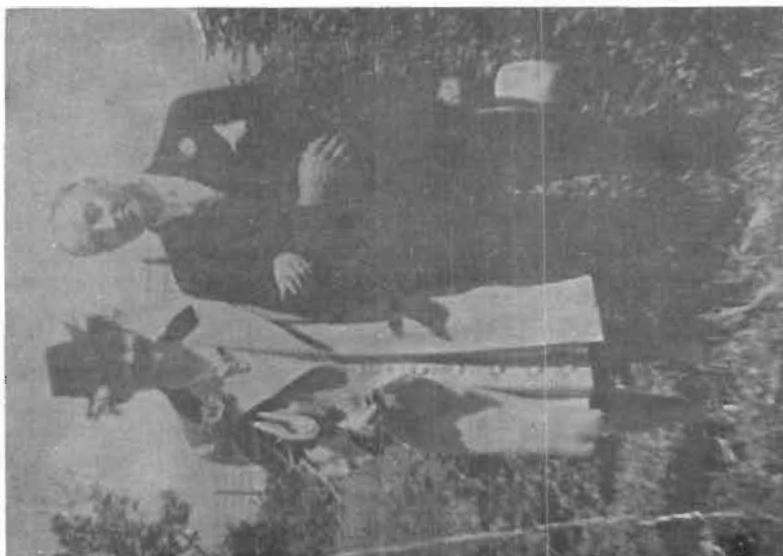

We had a standing joke in the family about Sr. St. Thecla as she was such a character - she was always cadging drives - well, she had to, nuns didn't have cars in those days, but she certainly got around..."

**BOOK 111 DONALD McCORMICK
24/3RD. LOCHIEL**

Book III lists the descendants of the second Donald McCormick who arrived on the "British Queen" and was accompanied by only one dependant. The following lineage places Roderick in Book III.

"Mrs. Christena McCormick, wife of Rory, son of Donald, son of Rory and daughter of Lauchlin McKinnon, died December 4, 1864, aged 85 yrs."¹

According to baptismal records, Roderick was on his land as early as 1804, and probably before. Until 1841 when all claims were registered, Roderick had maintained "Squatters Rights"² on his 200 acres of land at Lot No. 24 in the third concession of Lochiel township, Glengarry county.

The legend goes:

"When Roderick McCormick was given his grant of land in 24/3rd. Lochiel, he walked from the 'front'³ to near his property and climbed the tallest tree to survey his claim. He returned to the 'front' for all he saw were trees and said, "A jug of rum for my claim." He had no takers, so he settled."

Subject however to the following conditions and Provisos, that is, to the Maintenance and support of my beloved wife on the homestead during her natural life, also to the maintenance and support of "my" daughters, Catherine, Betsey, Flora and Mary, so long as they remain unmarried and reside on the property, and assist as usual in the ordinary business of the place, and I charge the homestead with the same.

Obituary - Mrs. Donald McCormick¹ 17/3rd. Lochiel

"Another centenarian has gone to her reward in the person of Margaret MacDonald, relict of the late Donald McCormick. Mrs. McCormick died on Friday of last week at the ripe old age of 103 years. For the past eight years she had been a resident of this village, but previous to that time she had resided in the 3rd of Lochiel Lot 17, from the date of her marriage in early life with Mr. McCormick. Her husband died 28 years ago. She was the daughter of the late Finnan MacDonald and a native of Lancaster. She was at all times highly esteemed and respected by all who knew her and her great age was no doubt the indication of a well spent life. She leaves three daughters and one son, the latter John D. McCormick of Grafton, Ont. She also leaves grandchildren and great grandchildren. The funeral took place on Sunday afternoon to St. Finnan's Cathedral and was largely attended. The services were conducted by Rev. Father MacMillan. The pall-bearers were Duncan McCormick, John H. McCormick, James McCormick, Angus J.

Obituary - Finnan McCormick¹

"Finnan, son of Donald McCormick and Margaret MacDonald 17/3rd., Lochiel, died from inflammation of the lungs in Hintonburg near Ottawa, on November 5th, 1898. He was 71 years old. His mother who is now in her 102nd year survives as well as his wife, 2 sons and 1 daughter at Hintonburg. The funeral took place at St. Mary's Church, Ottawa, interred in Notre Dame Cemetery."

Apparently, Ann and Finnan McCormick established themselves in Ottawa soon after their marriage. Hintonburg was in Ottawa West, the oldest part. The area ran west of Churchill Avenue down to the Beach with Richmond Road being the dividing line between Mechanicville and Hintonburg. The village of the same name was in this area. St. Mary's church still stands at the corner of Wellington and Somerset Sts. in Ottawa (1982).²

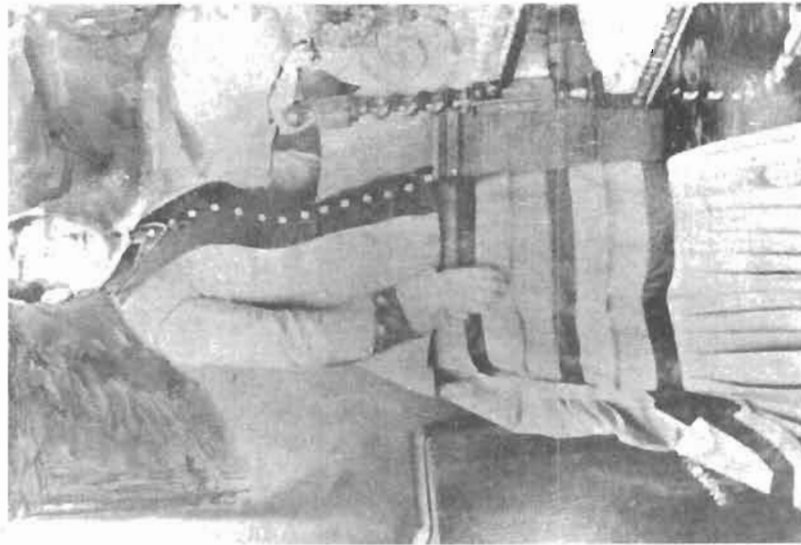

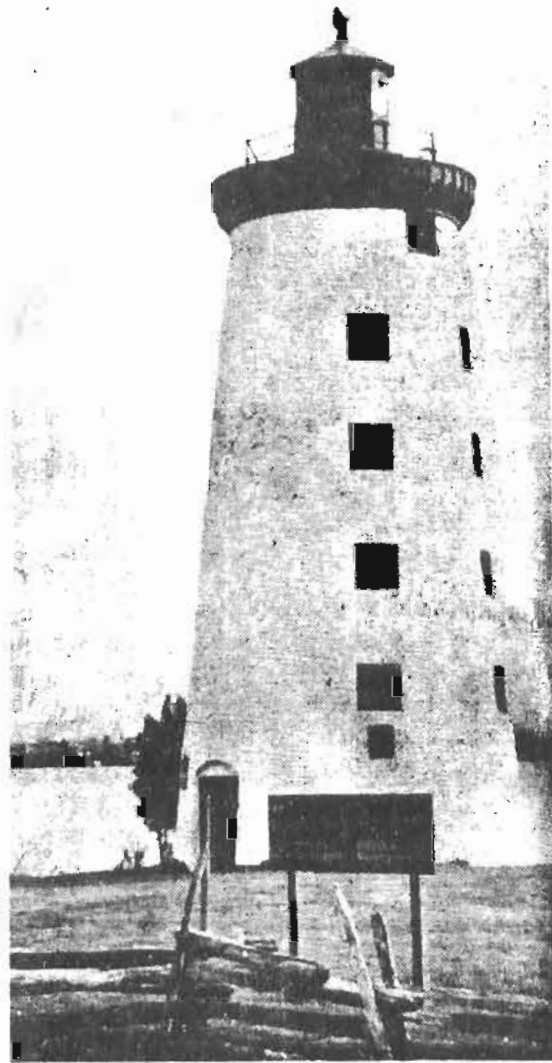

Battle of the Windmill

Now an historic site, this building overlooking the St. Lawrence River between Prescott and Johnstown was seized in 1838 by U.S. "patriots" invading Canada. Built in 1822 as part of a fortified grist mill, it was recaptured shortly after by a contingent from Fort Wellington in Prescott. In 1873 the government converted it for use as a lighthouse.

"Grandfather, (John R. McCormick)² as a young lad joined the military. Whether through conscription or voluntary is not known. He was taken to Prescott to fight a skirmish against some invaders³ (1838). It was called the Battle of the Windmill. In the later years, grandfather used to love to tell about being in the "Battle" and what a picnic they had. It seems that some dissenters moved to the United States. They organized an army to invade Canada. They thought us poor Canadians were under the yoke of tyranny and should be free. When grandfather and his group of Highlanders arrived at the "The Mill", they had to wait for instructions from a delayed regiment. This was the reason for th "picnic" as he called it.

Grandad's name was John R. McCormick, on my⁴father's side. I don't remember what the "R" stood for, probably Ranald or Roderick. John was always considered a country gentleman. He did nice things for mother. Mother was not a Canadian, neither am I for that matter. Mother was an American and grandad tried to make her life a little easier. After a busy day in town selling butter and eggs, she'd come home (21/2nd. Lochiel) tired. John would be waiting for her with a step stool he made purposely for her. He'd place it under the pedal of the buggy so mother in her long skirts would not get snagged and fall, which happened to some women. John would take her parcels into the house. I guess he liked mother. She had that air about her, being 5'10" and good looking. I can say that now.

"After John R's second wife died, he was still well enough for his age and loved to talk with people. Where would be a better place than after church on Sunday? But it wasn't *at* church. John would walk down with his cane to the end of the lane and sit there on a huge stone that seemed to be carved just for him. He would wait in the shade of a beautiful maple tree for the neighbours to come from church. Here he ws given all the latest news. This could have been the forerunner of the radio, I suppose. Dad told me stories many times of how his father and grandfather and family

would walk to St. Raphael's and later St. Finnan's church carrying their shoes. Some would go on horseback. The mass in those days, especially the sermon, was in Gaelic and outside the church after mass, news of deaths, marriages, births, sales and fires were told."

 "Father and mother (Rory and Annie) were asked to come home from Wisconsin to take care of John R. (McCormick) and his second wife (Maggie MacGillis) who died shortly after from cancer. John R. gave the farm across the road to Dad and Mother (21/2nd Lochiel). It was just diagonal from 24/3rd Lochiel. The school I went to was at 20/3rd Lochiel on John Hector's farm (McCormick), Book II. I would be eight or nine and all the farms had house parties at that time, especially in the wintertime. In the evening John R. would be tucked into bed upstairs over the kitchen, the warmest room upstairs, the neighbours would arrive and in no time the music would start. He would sneak down the back stairs in his red drawers and night cap and look for a "wee deoch". He'd sit down and enjoy the music and drink. It would not be long before he was sound asleep. There were no nursing homes in those days. We all took care of our own."²

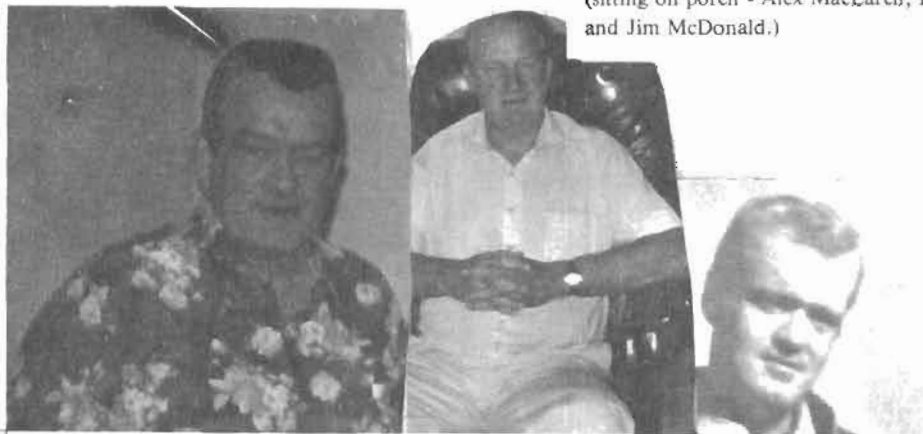

Memories of Florence McCormick Gelineau.

"When father, Rory, was about 20 years of age, he left the farm at 24/3rd Lochiel. Most young fellows in those days worked in the South Woods, along the Ottawa River or on the railroad. Dad joined the railroad and worked on it until he reached Michigan. There, he worked in the lumber camps of Michigan and Wisconsin. Now here, he was known as "Black Hawk". He was over 6'4" and had a good physique. The United States did not have any law force to resemble the Mounties of Canada so anyone who could rule a bunch of men became boss. Black Hawk became boss of a couple of hundred men. He was law! He had a small revolver that he used."

Here is a story often told and retold of father in the camps. "Men would apply for work in the camps long enough to be on the payroll, so they could rob the money sacks. This one time the robber held up Rory's office. Rory had his gun hidden and his dog was behind the stove. With the gun of the robber pointed right at Rory's head, his faithful bulldog leapt and sunk his teeth into the calf of the scoundrel's leg. Even with this, Rory knew better than to try to shoot, as this scene had happened before. He let the thief get away without the money only to catch up with him and a partner who was waiting up river. It is said that Rory used this gun on more than one occasion."

Rory was an honest man and believed in giving the younger ones who were travelling alone a break. One chap who must have had debts to pay or got lonesome for home pawned his ring. He asked Rory if he'd give him enough money for his needs. Thinking

he would return to redeem the ring, Rory gave him the money he needed and took the ring as collateral. The chap never returned. It's a beautiful man's gold ring with a half inch flat gold dust stone in it with the inscription in side "H.A.M."

"With Stuart McCormick's permission this ring was given to a great grandson or Rory's, also Rory McCormick."

In Arbor-Vitae, Wisc., a small town near the camps where Rory McCormick worked, a number of boarding houses sprung up for the men. One of these was owned by Simon Gorman and his wife Mame Geelan. It was at Gorman's Boarding House that Rory McCormick stayed. Here also Mame's sister Annie helped out when not teaching. In time, Annie, a widow of two years, met Rory and they were married in 1891 in Menomonee, Wisc. by Father Richard. Their first child, Florence McCormick was born in Schofield, Wisc. When she was about three years old, Rory and Annie were called back to Lochiel in Canada to take care of his father and sick step-mother.

Memories of Florence McCormick cont'd.

"After Dunc and I were married, we moved to Chicago Ill., as there were many jobs there. The First National Bank, the Chicago Exposition - 1933, were a few of the places where Glengarrians were hired to help build. We came back to Canada only for visits over a period of ten years.

"During that time, Dunc went searching for information on Dad, "Black Hawk" He went to Menomonee, Wisc., the town where Mother and Dad were married. Here Dunc was directed to an old blacksmith, who apparently was considered the genealogist of the area. This was in the 1920's and father hadn't been around that area for the last 20 years or so. The blacksmith told Dunc that indeed he did remember Black Hawk well. "He was a giant of a man in personality as well as size. He had dark hair and beard and piercing hawk-like eyes that never missed anything"."

"On December 29, 1929, Thelma, Ollie and Charlie and I arrived home (Alexandria, Ont.) from Chicago, Ill. Dunc (Gelineau) stayed on for another year or so. Coming by train was a long trip for children. I gave Charlie my trunk keys with which to play. He being only one year, what could happen to them. He *did* lose them, never to be found. The porter turned that section upside down and still no keys were found. The trunks for which the keys fit were sent ahead and reached the Customs before we did. Maybe the officers thought we were carrying the contraband because they took it upon themselves to smash open the trunks with a

sledgehammer, only to find the entire worldly possessions of a family going home because of the depression."

Memories from Florence McCormick Gelineau

"I was always a bit of a renegade. I loathed house work. When other girls were learning to do fine stitching, I was out climbing fences, or horse-back riding. More than once the wrath of mother came on me for not being more lady-like. In 1903, mother took us back to Wisconsin to see her family. I had a chance to ride on one of the first motorcycles in that area. It was a neighbour boy, whom we knew well. Of course, I wasn't going to miss that. Oh! the shame of it all! My mother and the rest of her family were horrified and stated to my mother that I was not normal."

"Down on the east place (21/2nd Lochiel) when father would be mending harnesses or patching a chair, he had this brittle glue on the stove melting to the right consistency to use. I would stand around and smell it. My, but I liked that smell." (Should I have told her she was sniffing glue, after all, she was over 80 yrs. now)

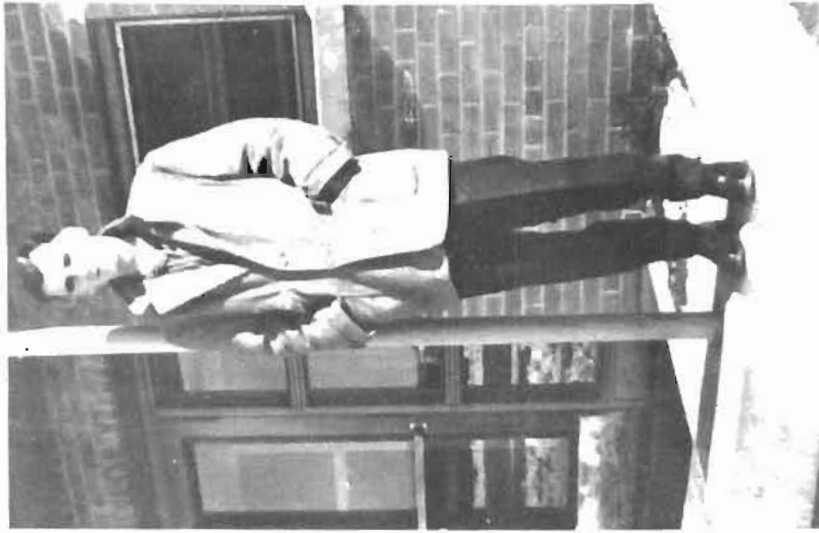

Stories of Frank McCormick.

Uncle Frank was a machinist, a linguist, a genealogist, a stone mason
and an athlete. He loved each one equally.

Frank McCormick did all his own lathe work (steel and wood) for the
machines of his woolen mill. If anyone in Alexandria wanted anything
specialized in wood or steel they usually sought out F. McCormick.

Here is a story that was told to me by Jim Keyes.

"One of the boilers stopped running in the building in which J. Keyes worked. The boss called a number of men in to fix it, but to no avail. He then asked Jim to find someone. "You've got to help me out", he said. Jim phoned Frank McCormick and explained the problem. The next day, Mr. McCormick sauntered into the office of the supervisor carrying a 6 qt. basket with some tools in it. About a half an hour later he left the building with the boiler in good running order. The supervisor said to Jim, "Tell your Mr. McCormick to give in his bill", and related to Jim that he would give Frank a couple of dollars. Jim knew that Frank would charge more than that. After about the third request, Frank brought in his bill. It was for \$30.00. The supervisor was furious and yelled, "Who does he think he is, charging \$30.00 for so little time", and asked Frank McCormick to step inside. "How come you charged so much?", he asked Frank. Frank said in that sideways smile, "I didn't charge you for what I did, I charged you for what I know!", and left with the \$30.00."

Frank McCormick cont'd.

Having gone to Ste. Therese College, Rigaud, Que., taught by French speaking Brothers, Frank McCormick spoke the language fluently. He also spoke Gaelic and did a lot of translation from and to the Gaelic. He enjoyed speaking the language. In his later years, the number of people with whom he could converse in Gaelic had dwindled to very few.

Uncle Frank was a genealogist of the McCormick "Clan" and a number of other septs too. One had to "get him on a good day", and he would answer all. He had a practice of keeping everything in his head. Not one item was written down. This seemed to be the custom of the early settlers.

Letter from Edna MacMillan, Lochiel

"...some of his (Frank McCormick) workmanship will stand as memorials to him. The MacLeod Cairn, west of Dalkeith, Ont. The Memorial Gates at Kirkhill, the stone fireplace at Keith and Velma Franklin's, Maxville. It reminds me of that Scripture Verse in Revelation, Chapter 14, v.13 "...they do rest from their labours, but their works follow them"."

Dear Mrs. McDonald,

"...As you know we had the pleasure of his company here for three weeks while he built our fireplace and we missed him like one of the

family when he left. It was in the midst of haying and everyone hectically busy, but we found ourselves sitting at the table talking simply for the pleasure of his company. We had never met anyone as entertaining or as well informed on an extraordinary number of subjects--and very modest about all this.

I had met him some years before when looking for someone to card fleece for spinning.

It was in June 1967 that Mr. McCormick built our fireplace. All our children were at home, Kerry the oldest about fifteen, Garth was two and a half, and Vivian just two weeks old. The children adored him, he was like the pied piper. He would throw his mallet over his shoulder and hike back along the lane to pick out his material from an old fence, every child following him, the dogs, and even the cat. He set his rough cutting block up under a tree near the house (I have a colour slide of him out here). Garth was delighted to be helping "Cormy". To keep him happy and out of the way, he set him up with a small sand pile and some bricks and showed him how to break them in two over a sharp line--even brought a small chisel just his size.

He apparently loved wild raspberry pie. As I mentioned, I was very busy with the baby and all, and as Keith and the kids were picking lots of berries, raspberry pie was about the easiest dessert to put on the table. Mr. McCormick was on his fourth slice when Eileen (about 12) who was sitting beside him said, "My goodness Mr. McCormick, but you do like raspberry pie!" And everybody, including him, burst out laughing.

He was very witty. He told me once his mother was Irish (with the same hesitancy that my grandfather's friend Pat Delaney used to admit that his mother was Scotch). With all the remodelling everything in the house was in the wrong place--our small news radio sat on the floor near the single available outlet in what was to be the living room. I walked in one time to find Mr. McCormick down on his knees with his ear at the radio, listening to the news, (he was a bit deaf, eh). He straightened up later--a little stiffly--and said, "That's what gives us fellows (Roman Catholics) the rheumatism--kneeling in them damp churches." Another time he didn't appear for several days, he explained when he finally arrived that another McCormick had died--"One of those six day wakes".

When the fireplace was finished, I wanted him to scratch his initial on it somewhere (it being a work of art like his brother's paintings) but he refused. "Masons don't do that kind of thing." Stonework was what he took greatest pride in. Once he was muttering to himself about some detail that wasn't just to his liking and I said, "Oh that doesn't matter--nobody will notice it!" "Well," he said, "most people wouldn't--but if I leave it like that, the next person who comes in and sits down where you are will be another mason and he will wonder what incompetent did this work."

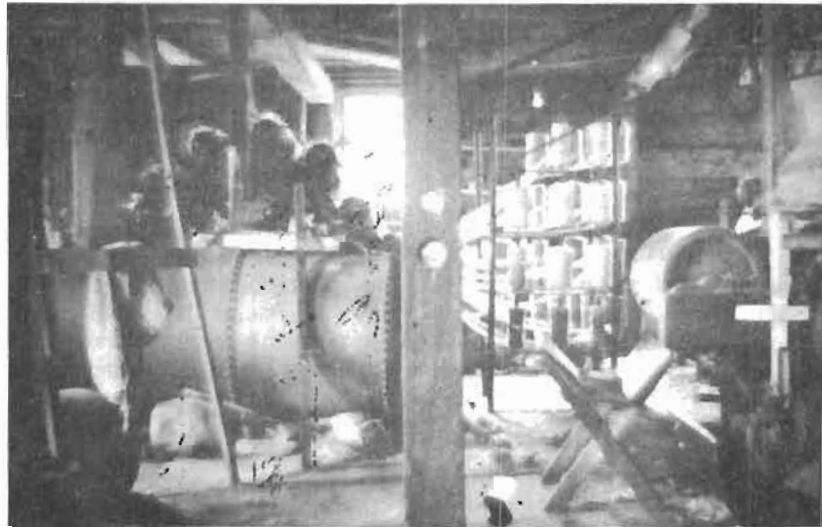
"A friend who knows the family well once said to me, "You know that McCormicks are like Indians. They work at what they like, when they like, and just as long as they like." This implies a total independence, unaffected by money, time or public opinion--and very few people today have the courage to live their lives like that. Again, I heard him grumbling to himself when he was laying the few bricks that go in the bottom of the firebox. "Don't like working with brick?" "Nah--all the same, monotonous". "You don't like building brick fireplaces then?" He looked straight at me and said, "I don't build brick fireplaces". I gathered that not for ten thousand dollars would anybody get a brick fireplace from him.

Incidentally, after the fireplace was finished--it works beautifully--and we put the heavy oak mantle on it and finished the panelling to the ceiling--I went to the jeweller and got a small plain plaque, sort of thing that goes on a sports trophy, brass and engraved with "McCormick 1967". This was put unobtrusively on one side of the mantle. He was up here once again a couple of years later and I think he was rather pleased to see this.

When he finally went into the hospital, I stopped in to see him several times, as a relative of mine was in too. At first he was cheerful and hopeful--he hadn't been told that his was usually a very long, painful and terminal illness. Then one day when I went in he said, "You know I'm not getting better - my doctor is so enthusiastic, keeps talking about my progress--he may be a fool, but I am not." Shortly after this he died. He had a very strong faith and I think he just decided that it was preferable to leave with dignity than linger hopelessly on. I would hope that I can do as well when my times comes."

Uncle Frank's athletic endeavors were first in soccer, which he liked and played well. He played a number of other sports, but his first love was lacrosse. Here he excelled, pulling Alexandria out of a slump many times with that crucial goal when needed. As Angus H. McDonell says in "Sports in the Glen", Glengarry News, when talking lacrosse, everyone recalls the day Frank led Alexandria to a 3-1 win over England's touring Lacrosse team, the Oxford-Cambridge team. In later years he had four sons playing lacrosse together on the Alexandria team at the Glengarry Gardens.

Stories of Emmett McCormick

Uncle Emmett was handsome, full of fun and as tall as his brothers. He was a good farmer and an expert with horses. Once he bought a purebred Clydesdale, "Golden Pearl Craigy" for stud purposes. He was so close to his horses that many times he would go out to the well and whinney at them down in the front field, to have them whinney back and come on the run to the well. This has happened, I'm sure, to other farmers but it impressed me.

He drove a team well. I will always remember my first ride with him. We were coming from Chicago, Ill., where we had lived for a number of years. Uncle Emmett met us at the train station in Alexandria, Ont. It was December 1929, cold with lots of snow on the ground. In the deep red barlow pulled by a team of "chestnuts", he placed Ollie and me down in front on the floor with a "Buffalo Robe" over us. It seemed extremely cold, or maybe I was not dressed properly for these Canadian winters. We pulled the long fur off our faces just enough to see mother sitting, holding brother Charlie wrapped so you could hardly see him, and Uncle Emmett standing, leaning back a bit holding tightly onto the reins of the spirited team. We'd look around but all we could see was a tail of a horse, the tops of bare trees and every once in a while a mouthful of snow that the horses kicked up into the barlow with their hoves. It was a most memorable ride!

4. Stuart McCormick

Uncle Stuart always loved the arts. Going to Cleveland, Ohio at the age of 20 years, he studied stage acting and direction under Dr. Timenov, director of the Literary Theatre in Cleveland at the time.

Before the Russian Revolution, Dr. Timenov was head choreographer for the Bolshoi Ballet under the Czar. Realizing the revolution was near, Dr. Timenov and those who had anything to do with the Czar knew their lives were in jeopardy. They took what belongings and money they had and left for Switzerland. Here Dr. Timenov, while waiting for his visa to the United States, had his name changed by dropping the "ov".

In the United States, he directed stage and acting for a number of years but with the coming of the motion picture, the stage died for a number of years. Dr. Timenov went bankrupt. Uncle Stuart left him and studied under a Mr. Sam Bradley of Hollywood. He had studied only 6 months under Dr. Timenov but states in that short period he learned more than he could ever learn about acting and direction under Mr. Bradley. He later came home to Canada, 35/2nd Lochiel.

Taking up painting with no formal training, only his God given talent, lent to his landscapes the trueness of colour. This became evident when the city of Cornwall, Ont., under Mayor A. Lavigne, commissioned Uncle Stuart to do a painting of the Long Sault Rapids to be presented to Queen Elizabeth II when she would come to formally open the Canadian side of the International Power Dam. Stuart made two paintings of the rapids at this time, each from a different angle. Mrs. "Bud" McKinnon (Margery Shepherd) has the other one in her fine collection of Stuart McCormick's paintings.

A number of Glengarrians recognized the painting of the Long Sault Rapids by Stuart McCormick, displayed at that time on the second landing of the impressive staircase at Marlborough House, London, England.

A painting of our first Bishop, Alexander Macdonell by Sir Martin Archer-Shee, President of the Royal Academy, London, Eng., 1825, now hangs in the National Archives in Ottawa. This painting was found in the house of a grand nephew of the Bishop, Sandy Duncan (Buie) Macdonell, Alexandria, Ont. The house was built in the shape of a cross and is still standing just east of the Graham home on highway 43. This painting, life size, was jet black from years of hanging on the wall. Uncle Stuart was asked by Rev. Father Ewen J. MacDonald to clean and restore it and he did a handsome job of it.

THE McCORMICK WOOLEN MILL

Lot 35 in the 2nd concession of the township of Lochiel, Glengarry county, Ontario is now the home of the Glengarry Golf and Country Club.

It wasn't until 1817 that an army Colonel from the British Army Corps of Engineers, India, finished his home on the above lot.¹ Colonel Alexander Chisholm emigrated from Scotland in the early 1800's. Because of his rank, he was allotted 800 acres of land with two rivers flowing through it. The Colonel, realizing the potential of the rivers, Delisle and Garry and the viability of sheep farming, had in his plans to construct a woolen mill. Priest's Mill (Alexandria 1819-1848)² and a mill 2 miles east of the town known as Muillen Ur (New Mill or New Woolen Mill) preceeded this mill to be built on the Garry. Muilleann Ur burned about 1830, and one wall defied the elements by standing another 60 years or so.³

At this time, David Tomb, born near Malone, N.Y. (1825-1897), came with his parents to Martintown⁴ where he worked with his father in a store and in a mill.

It was from here that he was requested by the Chisholms to come to Lot 35 in the 2nd of Lochiel and set up a water-powered carding mill. This he did, taking with him his carding equipment. A dam was constructed on the Garry River, as it drew more water than the Delisle. Mr. and Mrs. David Tomb (Isabella MacKenzie of Williamstown) and James settled in the cramped quarters of a corner of the carding mill awaiting the completion of their home, which stood near Cameron McCormick's home. Mr. and Mrs. David Tomb had four children, James, John, Mary and Annie (Mrs. James Mooney).

On March 29, 1910, almost 100 years after the Colonel had so gracefully landscaped the front of his farm so that in years to come it adapted easily to a golf course, a new owner settled. Roderick, J. McCormick and his wife Annie Geelan sold their farm six miles east of Alexandria to move closer to town. Rory McCormick bought 110 acres of land on 35 in the 2nd of Lochiel, including the Mill from the Colonel's daughter, Hannah Chisholm and Henry J. MacDonald, for the sum of \$7,500.⁵

In September 1925, Frank McCormick (Rory's oldest son) was married. He bought the Mill and just the land around it from his father.

The Mill was on the west side of the river, and directly across the dam on the east side, Uncle Frank had built his own shop where he did all his own lathe

work (both steel and wood) for the Mill. To the east of the shop, where the long lane¹ came to an end, a common sight was twelve tandem buggies, each pulled by a team of horses, tied to the fence while their owners and families were waiting for the wool to be carded. The women made an all-day affair of it, bringing their food and spinning the yarn as it was carded until all the wool was finished.²

Many of these families were French speaking from Rigaud, Ste. Marthe, St. Justine, St. Clet and St. Telesphore, Quebec. They made the long journey with their families in these buggies with 100 lbs. of wool in large jute bags strapped to the back of the buggies.³

My earliest recollection of the Mill was entering the building and seeing and hearing those huge belts on the same size pulleys, going from basement to the second floor and turning the machines. If we got too close, we'd hear the stern and everwatchful Uncle Frank yell at us, "Get away from those belts!" I can still remember him calling us downstairs to take our attention from the danger. The stairs always reminded me of a dungeon, but they were made of wood. His office was on the first floor and in it was the lever he would turn to shut off the water or let it come into the wheel. He did have a generator, but only for lights.⁴ The Mill was operated by the water wheel which was connected to the individual machines by shafts, belts and pulleys. The water wheel also ran the generator. He had a few electric lights in the house, but if the Mill wasn't running at night, it was back to the coal-oil lamps.⁵

We could not see the water coming in, but the roar of it conjured up in our small minds all kinds of adventurous happenings. There were always openings in the floor and we would squat down to see the fish swimming by. There were "Muskie's" in the river then. Many times Uncle Frank would allow us to fish through the holes in the floor boards. I can't remember if we ever caught any, but I can still remember the ones that got away.

In the 1930's, Uncle Frank and John Chisholm repaired the dam. They built a new cement wall facing for the dam.

On a number of occasions when we were at the Mill, farmers would bring their wool to be sold or made into custom yarn or blankets. We knew the process well, from sheep to the finished product. Most farmers in those days smoked a pipe that had to be lit with a wooden match. The farmers rarely smoked while the bags were being filled with wool at home, the wool having so much natural oil in it. Instead, they would chew on the matches or put them in their shirt pockets. From time to time, some of the matches found their way into the bag of wool. This was the fate of many woolen mills; a match would be ignited in the picker and an explosion resulted.

Some farmers would bring the raw wool in to be washed and dyed before it was carded and then take it home to spin it themselves. This process was

called "custom yarn." The wool brought into the Mill to be sold was always washed and dyed before it was processed. After each different colour was finished, the machines had to be cleaned with steel hand combs.¹ It was then placed on a conveyor belt that pulled it into the picker, then to the carder, another belt-like table that had hundreds of tiny wire teeth that separated the wool into softer and smaller pieces. This process kept the wool moving into huge rollers to make the wool into long, even, thick strands, not quite yarn. From there it went to the spinning mule, where the strands were wound around spindles, first the large ones, then to the smaller ones; where the yarn was stretched to the proper gauge for knitting. There were always women in town or in the country who would knit socks, mitts, scarves or sweaters to be sold at the Mill. We used to wear the long ribbed stockings. They were itchy, but oh so warm! We were never without a pair of mitts.

On the second floor, my sister Ollie and I would stand for hours at one side of the loom watching intently as the shuttle went back forth carrying the alternating coloured yarn in it's bobbin, racing from side to side through the two rows of beautiful reds, yellows, greens and black yarns. We'd cringe each time the frame would fall to let the alternate frame come up. This process produced the weaving.

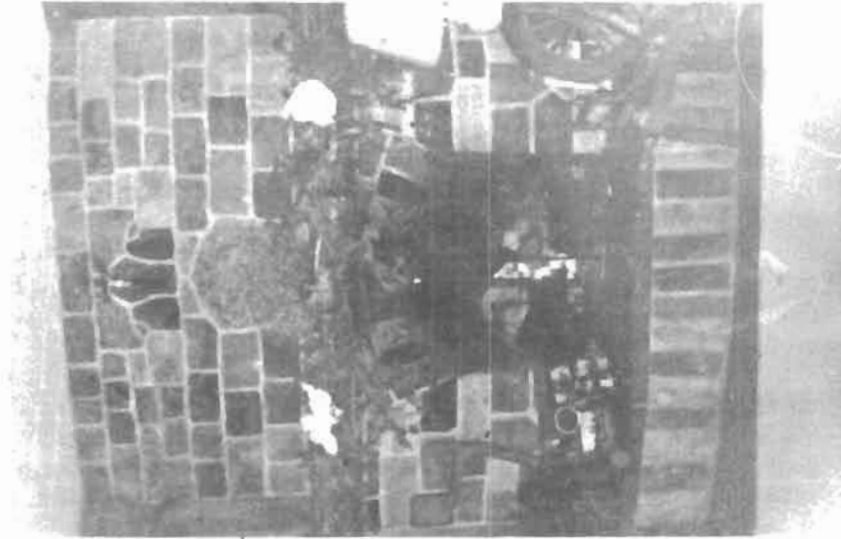
Our eyes were fixed on the machine, watching the pattern of checks or tartans being woven into a blanket or yard goods. We never liked the plain blankets with two stripes on either end, there was no action there so we would go to the house to visit with Aunt Mae. With all the work she had to do, she still found time to talk with us. She loved company, was a very warm, cheerful and a real lady. She was such a good cook that we hated to leave when it got dark and had to return home.

It was here I learned to do the "blanket stitch", watching Aunt Mae finish the blankets before they were sold. She was a very special person to us "small fry's", always wanting to know what was going on, and we would tell her. Some of our darkest secrets were poured out to her over a cup of hot cocoa and some of her delicious pastries.

Spending the summer in the Hyde² cottage, east of Grandma's home, after I was married gave me a chance to see the old Mill again. One awful day in July, I looked out the window towards the Mill and there was a huge puff of smoke coming from the top floor of the building. "Oh my gosh, the Mill is burning and Ronnie McCormick and Jake Labell are still in there," I thought. They managed to escape somehow. I went to town for the Fire Department, but since the Mill was outside the jurisdiction of the town of Alexandria, they had to round up the volunteers and take a vote on it. They came, up the wrong

lane (Tomb's) so they were on the opposite side of the river and couldn't get across the bridge because of the fire. The Mill went up like a paper box. I heard it said later that the cause of the fire was a match in the wool. The Mill burned July 1949.

APPENDIX

From the Glengarrian - December 22, 1895, Microfilm - G.G.S.

We are unable to determine which "John McCormick" is being described.

"We learn that John McCormick of 3rd of Lochiel who was taken a year or more ago to Kingston Asylum, and shortly afterwards ran away, and came to the home of his mother, widow MacMillan, and was taken back to the institution, being of unsound mind, disappeared from the asylum early in the fall, and despite efforts made he could not be located, until we learn from the Superior "Sunday Leader" of November 17th., (1895) that he died in the lock-up at Fenton, Michigan, from starvation. The following is the quotation, 'A tramp giving his name as John McCormick, Alexandria, Ontario died in the lock-up at Fenton, Mich., from starvation. He was found in a barn outside the city having subsisted for 4 days on the meal fed to horses and taken to Fenton where he had medical treatment and plenty of food, but died in a short time.' "

Charles Gelineau and Joyce Loutitt - Pine Point, N.W.T.

Joyce Loutitt's grandfather, Alexander Loutitt was a Highland crofter who came out from the Orkney Islands. According to R. J. Fraser, in "Scots Along the Arctic Circle", Thomas Douglas the Earl of Selkirk, obtained 45 million acres of land in the Red River Valley in 1811 which formed the first genuine settlement in the Canadian West.

Alex Loutitt married an Indian and was one of this settlement. His son also Alexander was born in Fort Chipewayne, N.W.T. in 1882. He attended the school in the Mission of the Fort and later went to the first school in Edmonton. He married Helen Heron of the Cree Indian Band. Following in his father's footsteps, Alex carried mail from Lac La Biche, Alta., to Ft. Resolution, N.W.T. a distance of 700 miles one way and this was done twice a year. His mail train comprised of 19 teams and one lead dog pulling two huge canoes on sleds. He later built the first

hotel in the north and it was opened for business in Ft. Resolution in 1924 ready for the inauguration of the air-mail service. The price of a night's lodging with meals was often paid in furs.

kindly expression when meeting him either on the street or in his Egg Grading Station, which would bring a smile to us younger folks. I don't remember the store that well, but in the December 10, 1980 issue of the Glengarry News, Angus H. McDonnell writes about his (Mr. Dever's) famous white horse.

It seems that the horse "Alex", had as good a memory as its driver, Norman Duggan, had when it came to delivering groceries along the usual route. Norman loaded the wagon pulled by "Alex", and the horse would trot from Dever's store across the Main Street and down to the Bishop's Palace. "Alex" had one gait and it was slow, but he knew where he was going. By Bishop Street to the dead end behind the old Alexandria High School where Mrs. Duncan A. (Alex Roy) MacDonald lived, "Alex" jogged. Then on to Ranny (in the bank) Macdonald's, then Dan Allans from St. Telesphore, then to Mr. McKay's the AHS principal, and so on and then home.

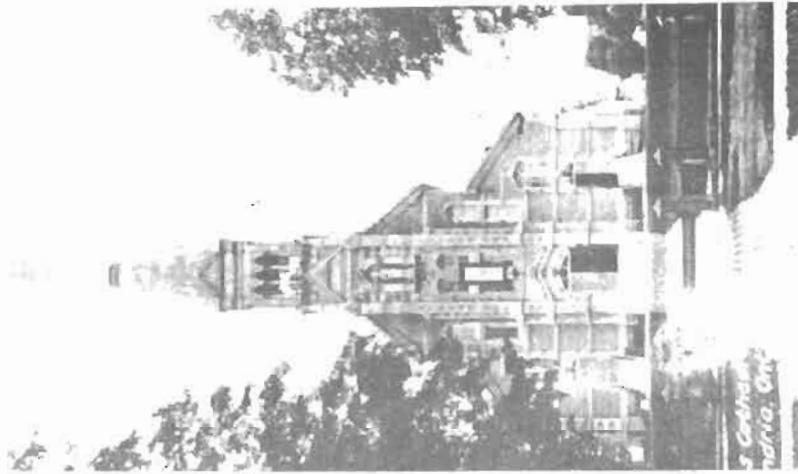

Little left to mark 102-year-old's life

It's not much to show for 102 years of life — a few toilet articles, nightgowns, bedsocks.

But when Elizabeth McCormick died Thursday at St. Vincent Hospital, those few personal effects were all that was left to show she ever existed.

Not a photograph or a letter or even a name of anyone she ever knew in her long life. And because she'd been bedridden for at least nine years, she didn't even own a dress in which she could be buried.

The staff at St. Vincent doesn't know too much about the old woman, who never spoke or seemed aware of her surroundings since being admitted to St. Vincent Christmas Eve of 1974. She was born Feb. 6, 1881, but they don't know where. As far as they know, she never married, and had no known living relatives. And since her only friend died several years ago, her sole visitors were hospital staff and volunteers.

"We like to think that everyone has someone who cares, but the sad truth is not everyone does," says Maureen Lintell, head nurse of the ward where McCormick spent her final years. "It's a sad story, but it's a true story."

Hospital officials say cases like McCormick's are rare and Lintell says most of the patients in the 550-bed hospital have friends or relatives who visit regularly, and who are encouraged to get involved in the patients' care and recreation.

There's one 102-year-old patient who still insists on weekly visits to the hospital's hairdresser for her special silver rinse and a manicure, and always wears a fresh red rose on her dress or nightgown.

And there's a husband and wife who share a hospital room, and who recently celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary with a party on the ward.

But for patients like McCormick, there is little contact with other patients or the outside world.

Lintell says the ward had a 100th birthday party for McCormick, complete with birthday cake, but the woman wasn't aware of where she was or what day it was.

Hospital officials say there was no personal information on McCormick's file when she was moved from Beacon Hill Lodge to St. Vincent nine years ago, and since McCormick was unable to communicate, they never found out any more about her.

A staff member at Beacon Hill Lodge was unable to locate McCormick's file Friday, but said it was probably in storage

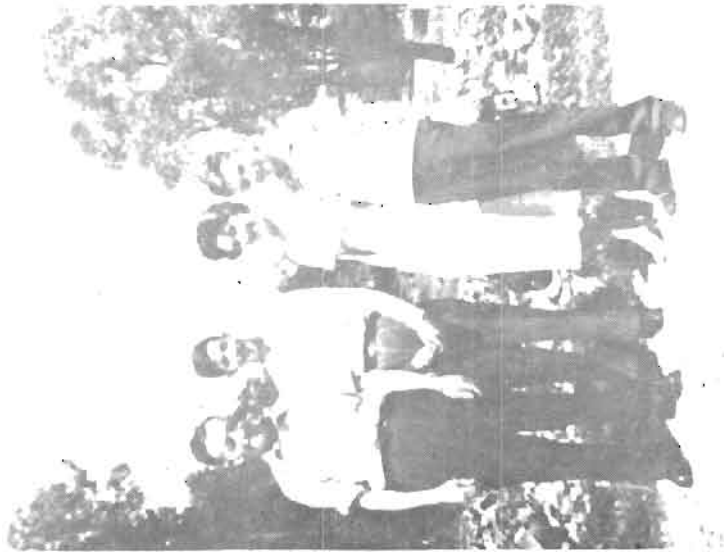
Professor Harry Hyde.

Col. Chisholm had a five room log cabin built east of his home on 35/2nd Lochiel for his gardener. After his gardener died, a music professor and his wife retired there.

Professor H. Hyde was an Englishman who played in the Band of the Cold Stream Guards, London, Eng. He came to the United States and composed a Presidential March for President McKinley.¹ He played and composed marches for George M. Cohen.² A good friend of his, Mr. Cudden, an English gentleman and a jeweller by trade in Alexandria, Ont., contacted Mr. Hyde and asked him to come to Alexandria to organize a band. This he did and it lasted many years. He conducted his own music for a midnight mass at St. Finnan's Cathedral.¹

He retired to this cottage on 35/2nd Lochiel after receiving a mantel clock from the town of Alexandria in appreciation for his work.

When grandpa (Rory McCormick) bought the farm in 1910, he also inherited Mr. and Mrs. H. Hyde in the cottage. When Mrs. Hyde died, he gave the clock to mother (Florence McC.) who in turn gave it to me and it is still running perfectly. Professor Hyde lived only a short time in the cottage after his wife died. He was sent to the House of Refuge in Cornwall where he died.

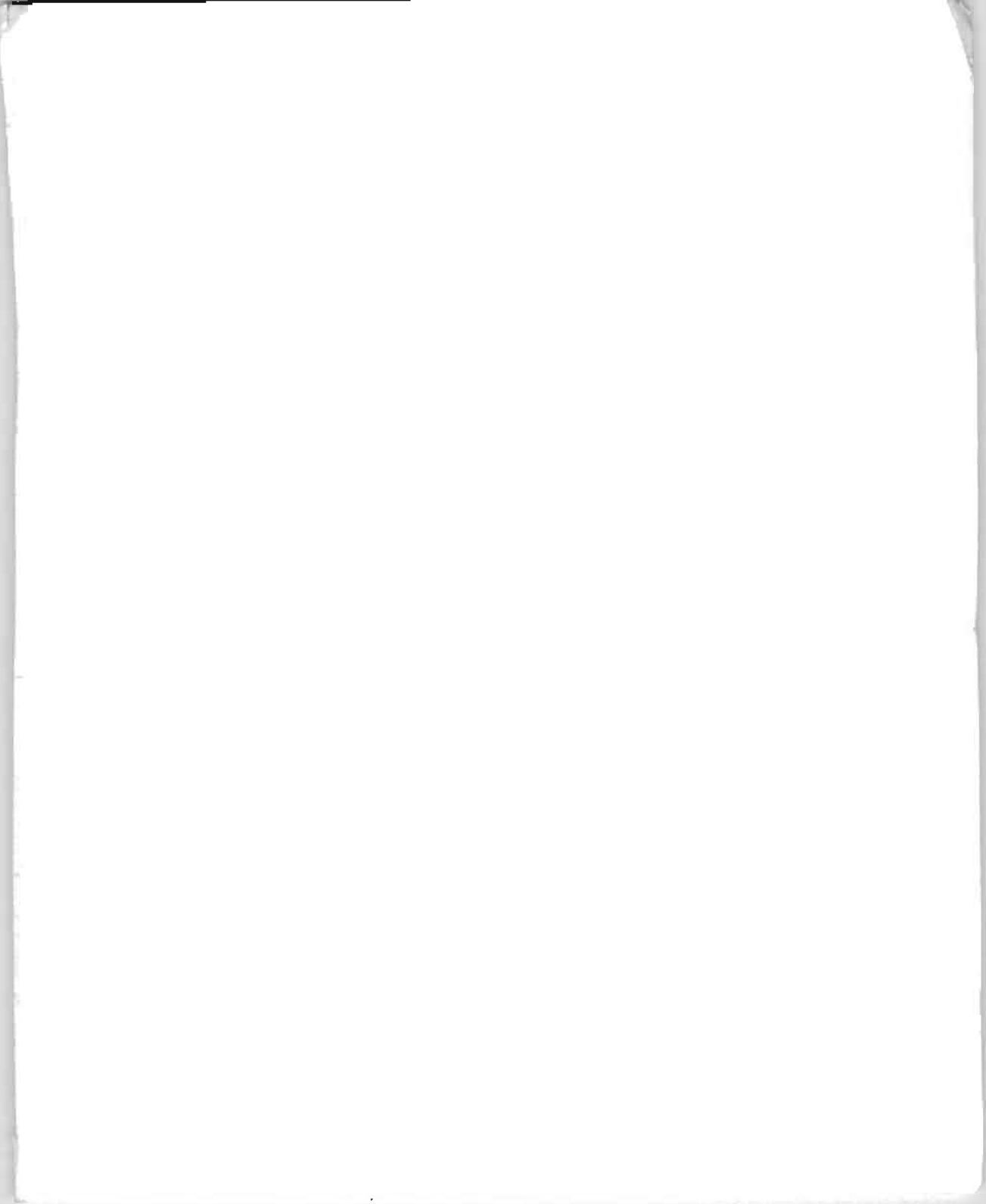
