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History of St. Mary's Parish
1850-1924
Biddeford, Maine

Much of our present knowledge of the early history of the Roman Catholic church in Maine comes to us through tradition, but the sub-joined statements are facts, whose records are easily accessible.

In 1825 Right Reverend Benedict J. Fenwick of Boston, Mass. presided over the diocese of Boston, which at that time, embraced the diocese of Portland. It is recorded that Bishop Fenwick journeyed through Maine in 1825 and visited Saco, and in August 15, 1825, celebrated Mass at the home of Dr. Green on Upper Main Street, Saco, opposite the Frank C. Deering residence. As far as is known, it was the first Mass celebrated in this section of Maine. Dr. Green was a well known convert to the Roman Catholic faith in Saco, but later lived and died in Boston. It is said that certain members of Irish families in the two cities were invited to attend the first Mass above referred to.

In 1850 the Irish settlers became so numerous that religious services were held as often as once a month, and presided over first by a priest from Portland, and later by a priest from Portsmouth N. H., Father McCallum. Later, Mass was celebrated regularly in the hall over the present counting-room of the Pepperell Manufacturing Company, in the very building now standing on Main Street above Crystal Arcade. Still later, Mass was celebrated regularly, every Sunday, in the hall of the original city building, as the hall over the Pepperell offices soon proved too small for the ever-increasing congregation; and in the original city hall the parishioners worshipped up to their occupancy of the new church at the corner of St. Mary's and Hazel Streets.

In 1855 the diocese of Portland was separated from the diocese of Boston, and Right Reverend David W. Bacon, rector of the Star of the Sea Church, Brooklyn, N. Y., was named the first bishop of Portland.

Soon after Bishop Bacon had taken charge of the diocese of Portland, a new parish was established in Biddeford, under the title, "St. Mary's of the Assumption," and Rev. Thomas Kenney was appointed Parish priest by Bishop Bacon. It was Father Kenney who erected the original St. Mary's church. Father Kenney did not possess a very robust constitution, and within two years after coming to Biddeford, in 1857, he died. While stationed in Biddeford, Father Kenney was domiciled in the home of the mother of the late Bernard Goodwin on Wentworth Street, and in this house, still the home of the Goodwin family, Father Kenney was the officiating clergyman in many marriages and baptisms; and it was also here that Father Kenney died and that his body lay in state pending interment in St. Mary's cemetery in Biddeford, just within the main entrance. The good people of St. Mary's erected a white marble headstone over Father Kenney's grave in loving memory, which still stands, elaborately carved in Latin.

In 1857 Rev. Patrick Bacon succeeded Father Kenney. Father Bacon came from Ireland, and was rector of St. Mary's from 1857 to 1859, when

he returned to Ireland, his native land, on account of ill health. Father Bacon was not related to Bishop Bacon as is sometimes assumed.

In 1860 Rev. Eugene Vetromile came as rector to St. Mary's. He was a native of sunny Italy. During his pastorate valuable lots were secured (the present parochial school lots), and other property was secured by himself. Father Vetromile was particularly interested in the welfare of the children of the parish, and was a devoted worker in their behalf. His pastorate terminated on his death in 1868.

In 1868, after Father Vetromile's death, a French priest came as rector to St. Mary's, Father Picard. He was here but a short time when he returned to France on account of ill health.

Later, in 1868, Rev. Eugene Muller succeeded Father Picard as rector of St. Mary's. (Father Muller was equally known to St. Mary's parishioners as "Father Miller.") Father Muller was a German extraction. Father Muller's pastorate covered the years 1868 and 1869.

Father Bartley succeeded Father Muller at the close of 1869, but in the spring of 1870 he was transferred to other fields of labor. While Father Bartley was pastor, he had as assistant and co-worker Father Ponsardin, a French priest. Father Ponsardin was really acting rector for the French contingent of Catholics in Biddeford.

About April, 1870, Rev. John Brady who had been a pastor for many years at Houlton, Maine, was appointed pastor of St. Mary's in Biddeford. In April, 1870, also the French parishioners were separated from St. Mary's parish, and formed a new parish, St. Joseph's, with Father Ponsardin as pastor. The French had bought an old Protestant church standing at the south-eastern corner of Alfred and Bacon streets, (the present Central Theatre building), which they converted into a temporary Roman Catholic church, and in this church the French worshipped while awaiting the completion of the basement of their present splendid church on Elm Street. As soon as the basement was finished, in 1872, they removed there, pending the erection of the church proper. In 1886, Father Brady erected the present rectory of St. Mary's, and removed from the old rectory at the south-western corner of St. Mary's and Elm Streets. At one time Father Brady was assisted by a young curate, Rev. Francis Finn, who died after a year or so. Later, after Father Brady had become enfeebled because of his advanced age, he had associated with him as acting rector Rev. John Harrington, at present of the Catholic church at Orono, Maine. On August 18, 1890, Father Harrington was succeeded as acting rector, while Father Brady was still nominal rector, by Rev. T. P. Linehan. Father Brady was retired at his own request by Bishop Healey shortly after Father Linehan's coming, and on retiring was permitted by Bishop Healey to return to his native home in Ireland, where he died some years afterwards.

On August 18, 1890, after having served as rector of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Portland for twelve years, under the guidance of that illustrious prelate, Right Reverend James Augustine Healey, the second bishop of Portland, Reverend Timothy Patrick Linehan came to St. Mary's church in Biddeford to be associated as acting rector with nominal rector, Reverend John Brady, who was practically

incapacitated because of advanced age. On Father Brady's withdrawal from the pastorate, Father Linehan was appointed by Bishop Healey, and in after years Father Linehan was appointed permanent rector by Bishop Walsh. Within two years after Father Linehan's arrival, he had built the present parochial school at the north-western corner of Elm and St. Mary's streets. It was at this juncture in his pastorate, 1892, that Father Linehan introduced to his parishioners the first group of Sisters of Mercy to teach in the parochial school, and they formed one of the most efficient and cultured crops of teachers in New England, as have all succeeding teachers Sisters of Mercy in St. Mary's school. Incidentally let it be said that shortly after building St. Mary's school, Father Linehan had St. Mary's church thoroughly renovated, installing new pews, etc.

About 1897 Father Linehan erected St. Margaret's-by-the-Sea at Old Orchard, a church which he named after the patron saint of his revered mother, Margaret Foley Linehan. Twice during his pastorate Father Linehan was compelled to build an addition to St. Margaret's church at Old Orchard to accommodate the great crowds that assemble there for worship. Father Linehan administered the affairs of St. Margaret's church at Old Orchard, in conjunction with St. Mary's in Biddeford, as well as those of St. Brandon's church at Biddeford Pool, which Father Linehan erected in 1916. St. Margaret's was dedicated by Right. William H. O'Connell, D.D., third Bishop of Portland and subsequently His Grace William H. O'Connell, Archbishop of Boston, and now William Cardinal O'Connell senior cardinal of the Roman Catholic church in America. Father Linehan continued the administration of St. Margaret's church at Old Orchard until the summer of 1921, when the Bishop, to lessen Father Linehan's burdens in his advancing years. Had this mission attended from Portland; but St. Brandon's church at Biddeford Pool remained as a mission to St. Mary's Biddeford.

In the year 1915, Father Linehan purchased for the church, the historic Woodman property on Main Street, Saco, and Bishop Walsh immediately made arrangement for a Roman Catholic parish in Saco, naming Rev. Timothy J. Mahoney, a native of Biddeford, as pastor of the new Saco parish.

Father Linehan also purchased sufficient additional acreage alongside St. Mary's cemetery to make the total acreage of St. Mary's cemetery amount to forty acres, about this time.

On the occasion of Father Linehan's twenty-fifth anniversary as pastor of St. Mary's, an honor jubilee was held in Biddeford, August 18, 1915, in recognition of his services as rector of St. Mary's.

Father Linehan's pastorate of 32 years terminated at his death in February, 1922, after only a week's illness, at the age of seventy-five.

Rev. C. J. Enright, Father Linehan's curate, on Father Linehan's death was acting rector of St. Mary's pending the appointment of a permanent rector by Bishop Walsh.

In May, 1922, Rev. Denis J. O'Brien of South Berwick was appointed permanent rector of St. Mary's by Bishop Walsh, and Father Enright served

as curate to Father O'Brien during the first year of Father O'Brien's pastorate. In October, 1924, Father Ballou was sent to assist Father O'Brien. Father O'Brien, soon after his arrival in Biddeford as rector of St. Mary's, undertook the building of the new church, to replace the one then standing, it having been condemned as unsafe, and beyond reasonable repair. Father O'Brien, whose health had become slightly impaired previous to his coming to Biddeford, although appalled and disheartened at the idea of the project, responded to the wishes of the Bishop, and accordingly, in September, 1922, called a meeting of the men of the parish, and afterwards the entire parish, to discuss the advisability of building a new church, and to devise ways and means of financing the project. The old St. Mary's church was immediately dismantled, the necessary furnishings being removed to St. Mary's school building, which was converted into a temporary place of worship pending the erection of the new church, and the old church was demolished. Work on the foundation for the new church was started with enthusiasm by Father O'Brien. To finance the first year's building of the new church, Father O'Brien inaugurated the plan of outright donations of one hundred dollars each from all parishioners; and in this scheme he met with appreciable response from a large number of his parish, as is evidenced by the list of donors, one copy of which reposes in the cornerstone of the new church, and another of which is posted within the entrance to St. Mary's school building. While work on the new church was progressing during the first year of his pastorate, Father O'Brien found it possible to renovate St. Mary's rectory. He also expended hundreds of dollars in improving St. Mary's cemetery, transforming it into a modern cemetery, orderly and attractive; and no improvement in parish property ever gave the people of St. Mary's parish greater happiness than this wonderful improvement in the appearance of the final resting-place of the earthly remains of their departed loved ones.

In October, 1923, Father O'Brien had the great happiness of presiding as master of ceremonies on the occasion of laying of the cornerstone of the new church by Bishop Walsh.

Shortly after Father Ballou's coming to St. Mary's, Father O'Brien, whose health was becoming more and more impaired by the strain of overwork and worry, together with the ravages wrought by a serious heart trouble, was beset with discouragements. Local labor troubles, together with the reactionary hard times that are bound to come after a period of war prosperity, short-time running of the local factories and in some cases, total unemployment, prevented many of St. Mary's parish from contributing as generously as was their wont; but Father O'Brien persevered, and in February, 1924, he had firmly established, with the assistance of Father Ballou, the envelope system of weekly contributions to finance the building of the new church, in place of the flat donations of one hundred dollars from each parishioner required during the year. Within two months after establishing the envelope system Father O'Brien was stricken with what proved to be a mortal illness, and in April, 1924, he passed on to his heavenly reward.

The Right Reverend Bishop, who had been absent in Europe for some months, was en route home at the time of Father O'Brien's death, arriving in New York several days afterwards. Rt. Rev. Monsignor M. C. McDonough, of Lewiston, was administrator of the diocese during Bishop Walsh's absence. On Bishop Walsh's return to Portland, he appointed Rev. M. L. Ballou administrator of St. Mary's. Only a fortnight after his return from abroad, Bishop Walsh was stricken with a shock, and died within twenty-four hours.

At the time this resume of history of St. Mary's parish in Biddeford is being written, St. Mary's affairs are still being administered in a very capable manner by Father Ballou. Rt. Rev. Monsignor McDonough is still serving as administrator of the diocese of Portland, no appointment of a bishop of the diocese of Portland having as yet been made.

Father Ballou is still a very young man, strong, vigorous, and an indefatigable worker for the material as well as the spiritual welfare of the church. He possesses incomparable executive ability, and in spite of that greatest of obstacles to material progress of the church, unemployment, or only short-time employment of the majority of his parishioners, he is forging ahead in the work of Christ. The magnificent structure which stands to-day as the New St. Mary's, with the interior yet to be completed, has been in a large measure, and is being paid for through the tireless and enterprising efforts of Father Ballou. His enthusiam is contagious, and he is meeting with praiseworthy response from all.

Father Ballou is also serving as administrator of affairs of St. Brendan's church at Biddeford Pool, in conjunction with St. Mary's.
